From the Commodore

ellow members,

Over the past two years, it has been well-communicated that our Club has

been through an accounting crisis. We have not had reliable financials for many months, and consequently have not been able to make informed decisions on investments, budget and Capital Improvements. We have asked the membership to be patient and frankly, help fund some budgeting proposals while we work to overcome these obstacles. We also have not had a long-term financial strategy and have been running the club year to year. Each past Commodore has done his or her best to leave the Club in a better place. Yet, for over a decade, due to our desire for a new clubhouse "soon", we have not felt the need to have a long-term strategy. We are making every effort to change this.

We are currently in talks with the Port and the Coastal Commission to try and find common ground that is acceptable to both sides (I believe that is what negotiation is all about). In addition, our Staff, Officers and Volunteers have turned the corner on our accounting issues. We can now generate reliable financial statements that are easy to understand and follow GAAP rules. By September of this year, we plan to present a full, year-long picture of the club's finances and to have realistic and reliable numbers for use in next year's budget.

In addition, I, along with the next three incoming Commodores, have put together a Strategic Planning Group to prepare for the plan that we will be developing a new Clubhouse. The Plan is based on a five-year time frame to obtain all of the necessary permits, permissions, and funding to be able to break ground. We anticipate that we will need fifteen million dollars to build the new clubhouse. (The costs and time frame are projections for planning and may change as we get closer to building.) This effort involves long-term planning and investment, along with short-term adjustments. Above all, this plan requires member buy-in. We are at the beginning stages of the process, but some of the near term items you will start to see, are listed below:

Capital Reserve Study:

A list of all Capital projects the Club requires to operate until a new Clubhouse is built and may need to be funded from the Capital Reserves. This encompasses all building maintenance items, Clubhouse upgrades and emergency fixes. The list will be prioritized, starting with Life Safety and Security, down to items the members deem necessary to enjoy the membership experience over the course of the next five years. This action is currently in process.

Budget Allocations:

As mentioned, our financial books are now based on reliable information, but it is not telling the story of how our Club operates because it is not organized in a manner which allows the reader to tell, at a glance, part of club operations each expense should be attributed. By September, the accounting department will have all labor and spending allocated to the proper categories, which are: 1) Bar/Galley; 2) Marina; 3) Clubhouse and Administration; and, 4) Juniors. These allocations will be presented in the 2024 Budget to the Strategic Planning Group, Finance, the Board, and Membership for final approval. This action is currently in process.

Volunteering & Fundraising:

The Club is member owned and for decades, members did a lot of the heavy lifting. Today, we are struggling to find the support we once had. It is important members know that every time we ask for volunteers, and none come, the money to hire this work is taken out of the Operating Budget. Every time we try to fundraise, and we do not meet our fundraising goals, the money is taken out of the Operating Budget. The Board and Staff take requests for volunteering and fundraising very seriously, so we try not to ask too often. But if we continue to fall short in these areas, the deficiencies may affect your monthly dues if we wish to continue to support these long time club initiatives. The Strategic Planning Group is tasked with finding a way to fund a future Clubhouse. This means we must continue to preserve our Capital Reserve balances and fund them regularly. It also means that we, as members, can greatly influence the Operating Budget by staying active.

Slip Fees:

Part of the allocation process mentioned above will involve the cost of our Slips. We must objectively determine what costs are responsibly allocated to the slips and therefore the responsibility of the Slip holders. Our slips are currently significantly less expensive than other Clubs. We believe that the cost to operate our slips - and therefore the price per foot charged to all slip holders - has not taken into account a number of major expenses, including the portion of insurance costs paid (that have previously, and inappropriately, been paid out of the operating budget) the cost of staff labor to maintain required records for all slip holders (one full time office staff member, etc.), and more. We will be holding workshops to discuss these allocations in August. I encourage all members to attend. This action will be taken to the Annual Meeting for a member vote.

Use it or Lose it:

The price of Labor and Food items have risen dramatically over the last few years. So have member expectations of how they want their food choices and service. This is true for members who come every week or come once a year. Yet the quality and service of our Bar/Galley is primarily being supported by one-third of the members who participate in club activities and services year-round, which is not sustainable. Most other Clubs our size have instituted a Use it or Lose it policy to support their Bar/Galley. We will hold workshops in September to discuss instituting the policy. This action will be taken to the Annual Meeting for a member vote.

Initiation Fees:

The Club Initiation fees are something that has been discussed and voted on a few times over the years without changing the fee structure. It has been argued that the long waiting list for membership applications dictates that fees should go up (supply and demand). On the other side, the waiting list is a guarantee of the continued health of the club by ensuring that we will always have a full membership list and 650 dues paying members. While the new Clubhouse demands that we contribute more to the Capital Reserves, there is a question as to how to raise these funds. One argument is that increased initiation fees will help, the other side argues that the difference in the monies raised if fees go up is minimal and the risk of jeopardizing the continued health of the overall membership level outweighs the reward. Both these arguments have merit. As such, a workshop will be held in October to discuss whether the members will support an initiation fee increase which will then be taken to the Annual Meeting for a member vote.

The Coronado Yacht Club has a goal to break ground on a new building in five years. Even if such an endeavor is not possible, it still makes sense to plan long term and build a strong foundation should such a time come. The process to do so is currently under way. The support and commitment of the next three Commodores is crucial, and I want to thank all of them for their contributions. Even more important though, is the members to buy in, supporting the initiatives, and providing input on how to design, institute, and execute them. I ask all of you to please be involved in these processes when you are invited to do so. This is our Club, and this is our time to set it up for current and future generations to enjoy.

The club was alive with activity. It was the 11th hour in the requisition of our clubhouse. The club was to be commissioned the last weekend of the month. Commodore Owen Wible and his board had accomplished all the preliminaries: a lease of beachfront from the city of Coronado,

A surplus Navy Wave barracks from 1st Street in Coronado, had it barged to our Glorietta Bay beachfront, a slab put in, the barracks placed on the slab, and a front deck built in pilings over the water. The May job was to get the Clubhouse in shipshape for Opening Day. Formerly the Club had built A dock, which accommodated our members yachts. Access was switched from the Del Boathouse to our beachfront. (The opposite of using an old gangway.). To do this was straightforward and a small guest dock was put in in front of the new club.

The new clubhouse was spiffed up by member work parties in the prior weekends of May.

My father, Rear Admiral Charles Allen, USN, Retired, joined the club 1 May. He was the member, my mother got a card saying she was a family member and I was enrolled as a junior member. At the age of 21 I would have to flag up or resign. (Shared memberships didn't happen until later. We attended all the work parties the month of May which was a wonderful way to meet our new friends.

Some of the people we met at these work parties were John Purcell, the straw boss, and a contractor, Duke Wellington, 1943, owner of the sloop "Betty", Bee Kempff, 1945, owner of the sloop "Surprise", Elmer and Kitty Muhl, 1949, owner of "Spray", Carl Ackerman, 1952, Chuck Soderberry, 1954, owner of the sloop "Annette", Carl and Teddy, a dynamic lady that owned a Lightening Class 19', one design, and a sparkplug for the fleet, which quickly grew to almost 20 boats, room for 3 or 4 in the cockpit and could be hoisted out and dry-stored, some of which were home built. Small boat sailing real-

ly took off in 1945 at the end of World War II. -Charlie












