## Coronado Maritime Foundation



The purpose of the Foundation is to support educational programs related to sailing and related maritime activities, emphasizing safety, respect for the marine environment and, in competition, standards of sportsmanship which embody the traditional Corinthian spirit.

We support area youth in the pursuit of these activities. We award grants to individuals and appropriate institutions such as schools. We support amateur competition, conduct events, and disseminate material related to our educational activities. We solicit and accept contributions from the general public and grants from philanthropic or governmental institutions in order to sustain these programs. We do not discriminate on the basis of race, sex, national origin, religion, or sexual orientation.

The primary sub accounts for the CMF are: General; Junior Activities; Lipton Cup; Coronado Yacht Club Junior Competition Fund; and Coronado High School Sailing Team.

### **Assets and Liabilities**

CMF Assets and Liabilities for the year ending 2022 are \$33,409.28. This amount is \$548.44 less than the prior fiscal year of 2021.

### **Revenue and Receipts**

The Directors of the Coronado Maritime Fund are extremely grateful to the 45 donors whose donations for the year 2022 totaled \$16,216.64. Interest earned was \$6.17. All donations were cash. The CMF also accepts donations of cars and boats through CarEasy. There were no car or boat donations this year. Donations are made by mailing checks to the CMF at 1631 Strand Way, Coronado, CA 92118. Donations may also be made by authorizing the Coronado Yacht Club to charge a donation amount on a monthly basis. For example, 19 CYC members donate \$10.00 a month to the CMF. Donors may specify the fund to which they wish to donate.

### **Expenses or Disbursements**

The CMF incurred administrative expenses of \$2,224.00: \$1,500.00 for non-profit directors and officer's liability insurance; Accounting fees of \$540.00; and Operating Expenses of \$184.00. Administrative fees were approximately 14 percent of the total donations for 2022. Administrative fees are fixed and will remain constant as donations increase in the world of post-COVID-19 sailing.

Disbursements this year include:

- Support in the amount of \$100 to the Kitty Muhl Ladies Race;
- Support in the amount of \$9,377.25 for the 2022 CYC Lipton Cup team;
- Entry fee assistance in the amount of \$570.00 for junior sailors in regattas held this year;
- Support of Challenged Sailors Regatta in the amount of \$1,000.00 and;
- Support of the Coronado High School Sailing Team in the amount of \$3,500.00

The Board of Directors thanks its supporters for the year 2022. It was another challenging year for all. The Coronado Maritime Foundation hopes to come back bigger and better in 2023 in anticipation of the return of competitive sailing events to pre-COVID 19 levels.

This practical seamanship training followed classroom instruction by CDR Bill Nesbitt, USN (Ret) and SCPO Tom Hellwig, USN (Ret), the Naval Science Instructors at CHS who incorporated basic sailing fundamentals into the program's curriculum. 15 cadets took part in this semester's voluntary at-sea experience, making them eligible for the Sea Cruise ribbon.

Crisp breezes each day gave the cadets the opportunity to sail into South Bay and under the bridge with each spending time on the helm and trimming sails. On the first day, we were treated to the sight of dolphins frolicking in the bay. And on all three days, the Navy provided quite the show with helicopter operations, swimmers, fast boats, and ship movement.

This community outreach is just one activity our CYC members support. For many years, the CHS high school sailing team has trained at CYC. Our junior sailing program is open to community members. CYC is taking the lead in adaptive sailing, working with the KMAC Foundation.

In anticipation of the fishing season, we held our first meeting of the year in March. We were blessed to have **Al Thomas** and his lifelong friend **Rick Evans**, give an advanced tutorial on fishing for halibut in San Diego Bay. For those who were present, it was not only an informative presentation but a reminder that you need to get off the couch and get on the water. These men are both in their eighties and continue to fish, scuba and free dive in pursuit of their quarry. They were very specific on techniques and tackle, and not shy in discussing where exactly they fish. Besides halibut exceeding 40 lbs, they have caught (and released) Black Seabass over 100 lbs, large white seabass, and even sharks to 200 lbs, all in the Bay! Above all, their biggest secret is....you have to spend time on the water to catch fish. It was an honor to host them, and they certainly provided an inspiration to all of us to continue engaging in your passions, regardless of your age. If you were there you know and if not, you missed out on something special.



## Recreational Boaters of California

RoC is a non-profit, 501(c)(4), government advocacy organization led by <u>volunteer</u> boating officers and directors from all over the state. They work with lawmakers to inform them of California boaters' needs and to protect and enhance the interests of the state's recreational boaters before the legislative and executive branches of state and local government and advocate boater positions on legislation and regulations.

RBOC conducts much of their business in Sacramento. Guidance from the well-respected lobbying firm of Desmond & Desmond is critical, consequently contributions from boaters and clubs throughout the State support these efforts. Unfortunately, contributions are not tax-deductible because RBOC's activities are considered political in nature. RBOC does *NOT* make contributions of any sort to legislators but rather relies upon its own persuasive abilities to steer legislation or seeks widespread help from the boating community to contact their own representatives to express an opinion.

RBOC was established in 1968 and their work in the past has included efforts to clean up California's coastal and bay waterways by not only mandating holding tanks, but promoted the building of pump out stations.

Another example, in 2020 the Governor's budget included a proposal for a 250% increase in boat registration fees. RBOC lobbied strenuously against that and in doing so was afforded some insight into the money trail. It was disappointing to observe that the \$60 million that funded Department of Boating and Waterways in 2012 had shrunk to \$5 million. The fee increase was removed from the budget. This year RBOC has succeeded in persuading legislators to modify bills that would have allowed boater's funds to be used to remove abandoned commercial vessels. And another bill that would have allowed rent control in California marinas was modified at RBOC's request to cover only permanent houseboats in San Francisco Bay.

RBOC also learned that boater's fees and taxes were being used for various parks projects including control of invasive weeds in the Sacramento delta and beach erosion. Engagement with Parks continues on these and other matters.

A wide variety of Legislation affects boaters and RBOC is determined to make sure that it is more to the benefit of boaters than to their detriment. We trust that boaters will contribute generously to that endeavor.

California yacht clubs and their members have been supporting RBOC financially for over fifty years. We are confident that they will continue to see the value in what RBOC does and that they will continue to support pro-boater legislative advocacy.
