General Manager's Report





We are introducing a new Point of Sale System to improve our food service and timing. This new system will be implemented over the next few months, and we will be able to create a more fluid system. We will have an upgrade to our ordering by providing handheld devices allowing our staff to place orders with more consistency tableside. Our current operating system does not allow for managing our Cost of Goods sold and this will provide us with a better

system to track food cost, beverage cost and inventory, resulting in what is predicted to be a 3% drop in Costs overall and a reduction in Labor. Our goal is to increase revenue and lessen wait times by being more efficient. We hope by doing this we will create a more consistent dining experience.

Second, we have several Workshops coming up that will help us to manage our financial operations and run our Club in a more efficient way. As we are currently working on our Budget for 2024 we encourage the members to assist in the process by attending committee meetings and listening to what is on the table. Many of the items we will discuss have to do with how we will manage our Club and our funds to ensure we are getting the service we desire. Everyone can make a difference if they take the time to come to the Club to "Speak Up! " We started the year with our motto as an operational team of "Lets make this our Members Club". We want to create a Club worth having for a long time by creating the Club we want to provide for our Members!

Lastly, please come out to the Annual Meeting in November to cast your vote for a Club Experience you can get behind! We are getting ready for the holidays with Halloween, Thanksgiving, Christmas, Chanukkah, Kwanza, Winter Solstice and New Years right around the corner. We will need volunteers for all these wonderful parties. We will need a lot of Support for our Entertainment and will be looking to get you involved. A Big Reminder – Our Casino Night is Coming up in November 4th and we are looking to crush it for our Junior Program. Lets keep it going for the Jr's as they will be our Legacy at the Club!

We look forward to having a lovely time this winter and spring with you all!

Finance Committee Re-



Ithough I report monthly at the Board of Directors meetings, on the second Thursday of each month, on the activities and progress of the Finance Committee, I suspect that most members do not attend nor read the Finance Reports that are on file in the Club Office.

We have learned from recent Workshops that transparency is a big issue in the Club, and I would like to provide a brief summary of the projects that the Finance Team has been working on since I took over as Chair in December 2022.

#1. The first issue was to establish closer working relations with the financial institutions where we conduct our financial business. We were not happy with our former banking relations and sought a personal relationship with both our banks that handle our operational accounts and our Reserve accounts.

Our financial team of professionals (Bill Huck, Tom Vessey and Gerral David and I) sent out a Request for Proposal (RFP) to 8 financial institutions in the area with criteria that we felt we needed to operate efficiently, seamlessly, and on a personally basis with our bankers. We Interviewed 4 companies of various sizes and scopes, finally deciding to choose Merrill Lynch for our Savings and Investment accounts and Bank of America for the operational bank accounts. (Both are part of the same financial organization and are linked seamlessly). This choice gave us a personal point of contact with each institution and the ability to easily transfer money between the savings and checking accounts with the ability to invest our Reserve funds with our investment manager at Merrill Lynch at an attractive rate with reasonable safety.

- #2. Transferring our accounts from our old institutions to our new institutions was not an easy task but is nearly complete and we are operating well with them.
- #3. We initiated a Capital Budget Project to help evaluate and budget for major projects and predict large expenditures on capital equipment within the club and for which there was no budget to pay for items such as replacement of a new food fryer in the galley, repair our antiquated bathroom and drain plumbing in the clubhouse and docks, replace the unsafe and rotting porch rail to name a few.

Our Capital Budget Team, (**Gerral David, Paul Baribault and Shannon Nevitt and I**) have established a budget and set priorities for these projects. This will be integrated into the operating budget where we can plan for these expenditures and also establish priorities on how and when to pay for these projects.

- 4. This year we have included a Financial Officer (**Kim Austin, CPA, and Flag Member**) who sits on the finance team and advises the Bridge, Board and Financial Committee on all finance issues. She has worked tirelessly over the past year to help sort out our financial issues and together with the General Manager, Accounting Manager, and a small group from the Finance Team, we have been able to publish monthly financial reports that represent an accurate picture of our financial status.
- 5. The General Manager together with the Financial Officer, Accounting Manager and another group of Finance Committee members have reorganized our past chart of accounts into 4 basic Business Units (1. Clubhouse and Operations, 2. Marina, 3. Food and Beverage, and 4. the Junior Program.) These, as accurately as possible, reflect the true revenue and expenses in each of these areas. This was one of the first steps in getting our financial accounts in order so that we can advise the membership in areas where we may need to adjust our income stream or cut our expenses, not only break even each month, but plan and save for future projects, emergencies and eventually for a new clubhouse.

6. The Financial Team, along with the recently established Strategic Planning Working Group is planning a series of workshops to advise the membership on our financial status in each Business Unit and provide options on how we can best reach our financial goals.

These workshops are designed to provide accurate information, provide financial transparency and planning options for the future.



hope that you all have had a great summer so far and have enjoyed some our weekly specials here at CYC.

We have been focusing on improving our Restaurant Service in the following ways;

We have scheduled MODs, Manager on Duty, on Wednesday and Fridays with a designated supervisor on Saturdays and Sundays. If you have any concerns or comments, please ask to speak with a manager so we can try and resolve any issues you may have.

We have staggered and limited our reservation times in order to accommodate all and be able to serve in a timely manner. We have adjusted this to having two seating with the first being at 5:00pm and 5:30pm and the second at 7:00pm and 7:30pm. Thank you for understanding while we figure out what works best for the club and how much our kitchen and staff can handle and without being overloaded and providing poor service.

Also, management has been conducting one-on-one meetings with each restaurant employee to review any areas of concern or of opportunity. We are in the process of hiring experienced servers and bartenders. We are introducing an outside bar on Fridays to help reduce bar wait times. We have implemented a monthly secret shopper to review the CYC dining experience and create consistency with the steps of service. We are also in the beginning process of introducing Toast POS system to improve both the member and staff experience.

Please visit our weekend to go window for tasty breakfast treats to healthy nutritious salads. The window is open from 9am-5pm.

We have some new exciting wines, and we hosted a wine tasting last Wednesday to sample some of these new wines. Please see your bartender or server for more details.

We are working closely with Emerald Keepers and our own green committee on improving our sustainable practices. Here are a few examples of what we have been working on - We are in the process of removing our plastic bottled vending machines. We have removed MOST plastic from our establishment and are currently seeking new products to replace our 16 oz to go cups which is the most used cup in the club. We offer many vegetarian options since nonmeat choices help reduce methane emissions cause by livestock. We are composting in our new garden area so any scraps from our kitchen prep goes directly into the compost bin. Non plastic straws should be provided upon request only. We are replacing our plastic to go utensils with bamboo and only on request. Our to go portion cups have been replaced with a plant-based cup and lid. We have laminated our menus to allow for easier reuse. We will continue to make this top priority and will keep you updated on this transition.

Please stop by the garden to see what it is growing! Thank you to **Tom Christiansen and Rose Ann Krock f**or their hard work and dedication to this garden. We can now proudly say from the CYC garden to your table.

Dinners are prepared by fellow club members, and the Monday Night Football Committee reimburses the cook up to \$300 for the meal (usually an average of 50 people).



Those Junior Members who choose deferment have until their 35th birthday to flag up or their membership will automatically terminate.

The Club Staff will make efforts to remind Junior Members and their parents of these requirement but it is ultimately the Member's responsibility to follow our Club bylaws.

Requirements: life jacket Fees non-members \$225, members \$180.

Thursday, Silver Sabot age 8 to 11 time 3:30-5:30 Silver sailors with an intermediate level. Sailors are eligible to enroll when they have successfully completed the bronze level. This class blends sailing skills with several important seamanship skills including boat handling, safety position and upwind sailing. Requirements: life jacket, water shoes, towel, and water bottle. Fees non-members \$225, members \$180.

Thursday: Gold Bic age 8 to 13 time 3:00-6:00 The curriculum focuses on refining the skills learned in both Bronze and Silver, while introducing fundamental race skills and knowledge. Requirements: life jacket, water shoes, towel, and water bottle. Fees non- members \$225, members \$180

Friday: FJ Teen Class 4:00-6:00 This is a fun class for teens to learn double handed sailing, sailors will work on starts, teamwork and racing. Great class for building upper body strength, learning to sail a little faster boat and having fun. Requirements: US Coast Guard approved lifejacket jacket Fees non-members \$225, members \$180.



Remembering Our Top Sailors





It was composed of three world champions. All of their boats were dry stored and had light hulls and polished bottoms. Needless to say, I was an outclassed novice and basically trailed the fleet. I learned a lot, mostly at a distance. I was urged to get a new boat and keep it dry. My immediate goal was to go away to a topnotch college which I accomplished my third year.

Besides Stars, I sailed in the local Lightening fleet of almost twenty boats in South Bay with another longtime friend, **Ed Turner. Ed** was dominate among SoCal Lightening races. He has my nomination for best skipper from our club. I must also mention my best friend and mentor **Bee Kempff**. **Bee** was an ace handicap skipper sailing before 1958 in the 26" sloop Surprise and later the 36" Sunrise. Sunrise dominated the L36 class in the Ensenada race against the best LA had to offer for a while. They raced as a class within the race. I consider these two men valid candidates for best skipper! Thanks to the skippers who provided photos and comments on the event.


