Port Captain's Report

Please be reminded wet slip holders are required to get their boats **Underway two times a calendar year**. One time is required from January 1 through June 30 and again July 1 through December 31. The purpose of these underways is to insure all boats are operational and can get underway in case of an emergency. To make this more convenient for you to document, just take a photo of your boat under or right near the Coronado Bridge and submit it to the Office with the completed underway form.

- If you have a wet slip please be considerate of members not so fortunate as you who have their boats in other marinas. Please file a **Float Plan** if you will out of your slip for 24 hours or more so we can accommodate them with a temporary slip. Thank you.
- Maybe some of you holding wet slips have been thinking about selling your boat and giving up your slip but know if you do give it up you would never get a slip back due to the very long waiting time. Please be aware there is a **rule which allows you to give up your slip and have the option to receive a slip of the same size back within 3 years**. In fact we just had a member, **Willem Van Waay**, who gave up a 40' slip a few years ago decide he wanted a slip back. He will be once again be assigned a 40' wet slip soon. Please consider this option.

Our annual fish scale calibration was completed on December 10th, 2018 and as always, fully maintained by San Diego Scale Co.

By the time you read this article our IGFA Registration will have been renewed for 2019.

Therefore, between the scale calibration and the renewed IGFA recognition and you catching a record size fish, you may well make it into the record books for international recognition – Good Luck. Remember, our current scale has a capacity to weigh up to 200 lbs. If you think your fish will weigh IN EXCESS of 200 lbs., do not attempt to use the CYC Rod and Reel scale, as weight in excess of the scale capacity will damage the scale. Thanks for your understanding.

You may want to put the following dates on your calendar:

Saturday August 3rd, 2019: “The 22nd Annual Southbay Combined Fishing Tournament.”

Sunday August 4th, 2019: “The Annual CYC Fish Fry and Awards Dinner” for the Tournament the day before.

CYC Rod and Reel will again conduct a fundraiser for our Junior Program as we have done for the last three years. This year, we expect to have even a much larger raffle table than in the past. This fundraiser will be held along with the Annual Fish Fry and Awards Dinner, as has been the case in the past.

Tuesday May 7th, 2019: Scheduled Rod and Reel meeting to address summer tournament activities.

Tuesday, November 5th, 2019: Scheduled Rod and Reel meeting to address Annual Rod and Reel Awards, and the election of the 2020 Rod and Reel Chairman. Yes, **Paul** will retire at the end of 2019, having served as Rod and Reel Chairman for 25 years. In the meantime, we will stay the course and look to have a fun year as always.

Sportfishing licenses for 2019 are officially available

an annual license. Other cards or validations must also be purchased, depending upon where you fish (or dive for lobster):

- Ocean Enhancement Validation (\$5.40)
- Second Rod Validation (\$15.12)
- Abalone Report Card (\$22.94)
- Sturgeon Report Fishing Card (\$8.38)
- North Coast Salmon Report Card (\$6.48)
- Steelhead Report Card (\$7.30)
- Spiny Lobster Report Card (\$9.46).

The state also offers lifetime licenses, starting at \$533.25 for kids aged 0 to 9 and adults 62 and older. A lifetime license for anyone age 10 to 39 is available for \$871.25, compared to \$785 for anyone between 40 and 61.

More information is available online at wildlife.ca.gov/licensing/fishing.

STATEWIDE — California still offers calendar-based fishing licenses, valid from Jan. 1 to Dec. 31 each year. The 2019 run of fishing licenses are already available for sale; licenses went on sale Nov. 15. State officials and others selling licenses do not accept cash. The resident license fee is \$48.34 for anyone age 16 and older. Nonresident anglers must pay \$130.32 for the license (also available to anyone 16 and older).

Low-income seniors, disabled veterans and recovering service members pay \$7.21 for the annual fishing license.

A one-day fishing license is \$15.69 (for residents and non-residents). Two-day fishing licenses are offered at \$24.33, while 10-day licenses will cost purchasers \$48.34 – the same prices as



Cruiser Navigation

It's January, and the start of a new year of cruiser navigation activities in San Diego. The San Diego Cruiser Association has a busy year planned for us, with 12 contests, beginning with the January contest on Saturday morning, January 19.

The January contest is typical of our bay contests. This contest begins in the North Bay at green channel buoy "19" with a few "U" turns near the mid mile markers on Harbor Island and near red channel buoy "20" for the first timed "Mark." The course continues east toward the city, then heads south east in the Coronado channel to red nun buoy "22A" and then to green channel buoy "23" for the second timed "Mark." Continuing southeast under the bridge, the course goes direct to the Navy ship pier "5" for the third timed "Mark." Mark III is followed by a 1.2 nautical mile blind run towards the diamond marker on the Silver Strand and then to red channel buoy "36" for the fourth "Mark." The final timed Mark is bridge pier "18" followed by the finish at red channel buoy "24."

Many of our contests contain a "blind point" run. This is a timed run for a specified distance (typically around one nautical mile). The contestant is allowed to use a stopwatch, starting the watch at the beginning of the timed run. When the predicted time for the run has expired, the contestant must turn immediately and proceed on a course toward the next specified check point.

The January contest will be hosted by the Southwestern YC, where they will provide an award luncheon following the contest.

Our contests are timed to start between 8 AM and finish by 10:30 AM. This allows us to be on the water before most of the pleasure craft traffic, and the start of scheduled sailboat races. Most bay activity we encounter during our contests are the early morning fishermen, and occasionally a naval vessel or cruise ship. The early finish time permits all contestants to return to their home port, and have time to commute to the location of the post contest award luncheons.

The February contest will be hosted by our own Club, with an award luncheon on the west lawn planned following the contest on Saturday, February 23.

We are always looking for new members to join our cruiser navigation family. Southwestern has announced they have 5 new candidate contestants who will be learning the joy of being on the water one Saturday morning a month and participating in our contests. I'd hope that Coronado YC could join Southwestern, and add to our small cadre of cruiser navigators.

If you own and cruise a mid-sized power boat, consider learning about cruiser navigation contests by joining one of us on board for a "test" run. There is nothing to lose, and based on my personal experience, much to gain in both knowledge of your boat, confidence in your boat handling, and enjoyment in the camaraderie amongst our Skippers. To get started, any one of us will be more than willing to guide you step by step as you enter into this fascinating sport.

The Friendly Seal

One day, as I was polishing the topsides of my live aboard boat, I had an unexpected friend visit. I had the boat pulled in close to the dock so I could lay on the dock and polish the topsides. All of a sudden, I saw eyes between me and the boat, about a foot away in the gap. We look at one another for a moment, then I said "Hello, Mr. Seal, welcome to Coronado Yacht Club" and backed away about a foot. I thought he must be one of the Navy Seals from the Amphibian Base. He was probably used to humans. Not knowing anything about trained seals, I started a conversation 'til he got bored and departed. I was totally amazed by this whole experience.



5 White Doves

I was on my way one afternoon to Charlie Ingle's 'Celebration of Life' at the Club side yard, when 5 pure white doves fly east past close overhead. I stopped dead to watch them fly by. My mind asked me, "Is this an omen?" I admit I don't know, but I think so. I normally don't think of things as supernatural. What do you think?

Mayday, Mayday

I was racing on our boat 'Mistress' in our first CYC Acapulco challenge in 1956, when off Cape San Lucas we heard on our radios a Mayday, Mayday distress message from one of the racers far ahead. Their location was like 12 hours ahead of us so we could be of no assistance and likewise any shore assistance was hours away and would arrive after dark. It came to all of us aboard that our endeavor was not without risk which I took as a serious thing for the first time in my life.

As it turns out, there was a propane explosion in the hull. The cabin was instantly afire and the crew instantly jumped overboard as they were, mostly in shorts with no safety equipment. This confirms that fire is the most feared danger afloat.

Fortunately, they were boat for boat with another contender who saw the explosion and immediately turned to perform the much needed rescue. Afterwards, miraculously, they had no injuries and resumed the race to the finish and fortunately they had provisions and water for a double crew.

We didn't have a boat in sight at the time.

Rescuing River

River was a very young lad but already boat wise and his mother was a trained life guard. So happens that one day **River** was playing Captain with the Club's Wheel on the front porch within a few feet from his mother but was blinded from her by the wheel cover. Unrealized by the mother, the club identification sign which serves as a backstop stop at the rail had been removed for maintenance leaving an open space.

For some reason, the mother immediately sensed danger, and blinded by the wheel cover realized the potential danger and feeling the child missing, vaulted the rail instantly and no damage was done to anyone. CYC member **Mike Whittemore** was present and witnessed the dramatic rescue.

McKane's Folly

Joe McKane was one of Coronado Yacht Club's characters. Liked by most everybody and widely known and loved. He loved boats, high times, both his wives, Louise who died too young and Ruth were both sweethearts, his dog and his boat and his MG. The MG came about because he talked Bob Lenson into rebuilding an engine and body and got a professional paint job just so he, his dog and his car could be an entry in the Annual 4th of July parades, which he did for years. And it happens, one year he took his entourage to the Coronado Yacht Club parking lot, through the front door, across the dining area and into the bar to announce he was here, car and all!

The SD Harbor Porpoise

Did you ever see our local porpoise? If you have, you had to be around for a long time, like me. When I started sailing they were here till we trashed our bay. Magnificent creatures, larger than a man, with the bulbous forehead, beautifully sleek, light grey in color. They were always a treat to the eye swimming in pods of 3 to 6 with their synchronized up and down surface swimming, a ballet of the sea. I never tired of watching them. If you know their story let me know.
