# From the Crow's Nest

We have a new ability for slip holders to be able to monitor their slips' electrical consumption. I've met with Austin, President of MarineSync, to establish the ability and protocols for members to be able to review their electrical usage by signing onto the MarineSync website. Members will be able to opt-in by providing the front office with their slip number, email address and phone number. CYC staff will then register this information into system and provide members the viewing access to their data by slip.

We kick off our busy regatta season at CYC this month. Between March 15<sup>th</sup> through March 17<sup>th</sup>, we will be co-hosting the NOOD Regatta with San Diego Yacht Club, followed by the 29er Midwinters West the following weekend of March 22<sup>th</sup> through 24<sup>th</sup>. # Rod and Reel Report

The Annual Fred Hall Boat and Fishing show is scheduled for March 28th – 31st, 2019, to be held at the Del Mar Fair Grounds. Kids 15 and under get in for free. The Fred Hall Show covers all aspects of fishing and is a real family event. If you have questions, the show will have the answers and you will have a great time. Don't miss out - see you there.

Last month, I addressed the lack of fish being recorded. Well, Flag Member **Al Thomas** climbed aboard his boat "R Boat" and on January 28<sup>th</sup>, he landed a 5 lb. halibut. Then on January 30<sup>th</sup>, he again returned to his secret location on San Diego Bay and landed a 5 ½ lb. halibut. Congratulations **Al**, it gives me something to write about. Due to the weather systems we have had for the last two months, our anglers have been very selective as they decided weather to go fishing or to wait for the weather to improve – like summer time.

Recently, I took note of an article in the January 25<sup>th</sup> – February 7<sup>th</sup>, 2019 log. "California Sport Fishing League encourages early fishing participation."

Reportedly, according to a national survey, the number of diehard anglers is getting older and declining in numbers faster than the rate of new anglers. Something to think about.

The California Ocean Sport Fishing Regulations Booklet has a single page devoted to non-take species, Take and Possession of the following species is not allowed:

Giant sea bass, garibaldi, rockfish, yelloweye rockfish, cowcod and bronzed spotted rockfish.

And there is a very strict limit on the following species:

Statewide bag limit of three fish on bocaccio and a state-wide bag limit of five fish on black rockfish.

Winter months are a prime time to hook any of the above fish, as winter time lends itself to bottom fishing due to the lack of surface fishing.

It is further recommended that all anglers obtain a California Ocean Sport Fishing Regulation Booklet yearly, as many regulations change year – to – year. Most tackle shop have the booklets available.



# Cruiser Navigation Report

**W**ow! Talk about the Luck of the Irish.

Our CYC hosted cruiser navigation contest was held on Saturday, February 23, under clear sunny skies, and gentle southwest breezes... This weather was just a welcome, and lucky respite from the cold and rain we have been experiencing since the beginning of 2019, and was enjoyed by all the contestants.

The course, written by your scribe, began at bridge pier "20" and headed north to the Navy mooring buoy "19" just off the east end of Harbor Island for the first timed "Mark." The next timed legs led to red channel buoy "20" and returned to green channel buoy "21" for the second "Mark." The course then led south to the bridge for the third "Mark" and further south to red channel buoy "36" for the fourth "Mark."

After this straightforward course, the last two timed legs were the challenge. Beginning at red channel buoy "36" we programmed a timed nautical mile run to a blind point towards the diamond marker on the Silver Strand, followed by a course north towards red channel buoy "26" where the Mark was called when aligned with the south side of Navy Pier "1." This was followed by a little navigational fun by turning towards the red channel buoy "26A" and doing a "U" turn to starboard when abeam of the buoy to port. The final leg was to the finish at bridge pier "18."

The flood currents for the morning turned out to be the decisive factor in the scores. Contestants who adjusted their throttles for the weaker than predicted currents did well. Others, not so well, including your scribe.

When the scores were announced, following a great "dogs and burgers" luncheon at our Club, all but two of the top scores were 1 percent error or greater. And our winner from last month, **Jeff Calabrese**, continued his winning ways with a 0.88 percent error, earning him second place overall and the Adm. Robert Erly Perpetual Trophy Award... Congratulations again **Jeff!**

**Magnus Karlsson** was not far behind **Jeff** with a 1.1 percent error, capturing fourth place. Congratulations **Magnus!**

Next month's rally, sponsored by Silver Gate Yacht Club, is just two weeks away on March 9. We'll scramble to improve our scores and will report the results in the next issue.

The continuing and combined efforts to recruit new cruiser navigators are beginning to show results, with three new members from Silver Gate YC and one new member from SWYC joining the San Diego Cruiser Association. The really good news is that we have some of our own CYC skippers also interested in joining the fun and camaraderie on the water. Hopefully we'll see some more Crown burgees on the water in the near future.

If you own and cruise a mid-sized power boat, consider learning about cruiser navigation contests by joining one of us on board for a "test" run. There is nothing to lose, and based on my personal experience, much to gain in both knowledge of your boat, confidence in your boat handling, and enjoyment of the camaraderie amongst our Skippers. To get started, any one of us will be more than willing to guide you step by step as you enter into this fascinating sport.


## *The Formation of CYC's Jr. Sailing*

At first, we were 3. "Baines" Haines, Bob Phillips, and me. The year was 1947. Our new clubhouse, a former wave barracks on 1<sup>st</sup> street, was the focus of the yacht club's attention. For us Junior Members, it was the start of Junior Yacht Club activities. Three trophies were donated and raced for and are still raced for 73 years later. Thus it was that Baines was one of my 1<sup>st</sup> friends here at the Club and we enjoyed the competition of our Junior Races. Baines passed over the bar a few weeks ago and I wish him Bon Voyage and my sincerest condolences to his family. He will be missed...

The occasion reminds me of those sweet days.



In early 1947, my father, Admiral Charles Allen, asked me what I wanted for a High School graduation present to which I replied, "a racing sailboat". He said that's a pretty big wish but I'll look into it.

So by June, he had bought us a racing boat, the Star 616 from a club member. He also joined the club and I automatically became a junior member at no cost. In

those days, my memory says his cost to join was \$10 and monthly dues were \$10 which I am finding it hard to believe today.

The club had acquired a surplus Wave Barracks from 1<sup>st</sup> street and got city land at the head of Glorietta Bay. A pad had been poured and the barge transfer completed. We met members first with weekly member work parties to finish the clubhouse for an Opening Day at the end of May.

Coincidentally, the Junior Program was activated for sail racing. Three trophies were activated and are still awarded every year. They are "Seven-Up Cup", donors Elmer Muhl & 7-Up. "The Uncle Bill Junior Yacht Trophy". Donor Uncle Bill was a perfect gentleman, did club's Race Committee for many years and was Marion Niemyer's father. Marion was wife to Bob Niemyer, Coronado Ferry engineer and both were close friends for many years. In 1950, Bob and I drove back to Buffalo, N.Y. for the Lightning Championship and crewed for Myron Eystone from LA, a close friend. This was our first 50+ boat race. My memory says we finished about 12<sup>th</sup> against the "big" boys. I did not know it at the time, but Bob and Marion had married days before the trip and was later teased for taking his "honeymoon" trip. I got a ride from one of the southern crews to my new home at Duke University.

The 3<sup>rd</sup> trophy was the "Jr. Commodore Corinthian Award", donated by Bob Phillips.

Within a year or two, the Naples Sabot became very popular all over Southern California. Our Junior training boat started in our club by my best friend "Bee" Kempff who announced one day he had bought "us" a boat. How much I inquired? "\$100", he replied and I said, "Okay, \$50 sounds like a deal for me", except it is a one-man boat and there are 2 of us. He then said, "We can trade off". It was not long until we had a second sabot.
