We had a full weekend on March 18-20, with both the 29er Mid-Winter West Regatta and the small boat classes of the NOOD Regatta racing in the Southbay, both substantial regattas on their own, here at our club for one action packed weekend! We had **58 vessels** racing in the NOOD and **27 vessels** racing in 54 races for the Mid-Winters. I had the honor of presenting trophies for the South Bay portion of the NOODs at the SDYC and it was great to see the Overall NOOD winner was a small boat J/70 class, Mid Life Crisis. **VIC Sandke** presented the Mid-Winter trophies here at the club, so both regattas were represented by the club. It is so awesome to see our club vibrating with sailing activity – that’s what

Unfortunately, with only a small group (30) of our membership coming to participate at both workshops, the conversations leaned mainly towards lowering slip fees and raising membership dues. The strong opinions of only 30 members cannot be the overall heart of our club of 615 members and I would encourage all members, with or without slips to pay closer attention to the possible changes coming to the club membership with regards to recommendations on how to generate revenue and cut overall expenses. As your Commodore, and I know the heart of your board, it is our job to protect and ensure that the overall member experience continues to increase and improve, as we are heading into the future. We need to be focused on our club’s future more than ever now with our new temporary facility and new club house on the near horizon. We need to truly understand what it will take to run a more vibrant and efficient Yacht Club that continues to attract young sailing and yachting families.

On yet another sad note, we have had some boat break-ins this past month, and want to encourage boat owners to ensure your vessel is locked and secured. So far it has only been small items that can be easily lifted and carried off the premises without notice, therefore it seems the break ins may be happening during the day. GM Lou is tightening up security to try to put an end to this unnecessary and irritating activity. Neighborhood watch is always the best security – so keep an eye out when you see anyone you don’t know -boat workers, or strangers- lurking around someone’s boat or the club grounds, who doesn’t seem to belong there, and contact the office immediately.

We had another sold-out Easter Brunch and the kids had a great afternoon hunting for Easter Eggs. April 9th brings Family Day along with a fishing tournament. The board waived the rule of fishing from the dock for this special day, so we can start training our future Rod and Reel members. Maybe S/C **Dodson** will stop by to give the tykes some tips. So drop by, lend a hand, share your fishing tricks, or just watch the fun and be blessed. There will also be a band in the yard and bounce house later in the day. Bring your whole family and stay for a BBQ and participate in the fun.

We are also having our first “Grown Up Movie Night” (previously named Adult Movie Night, but we thought better of that). We will be showing “Captain Ron” on Saturday evening April 16th at 8pm. So come snuggle up on the lawn with your sweetheart and have a date night. The bar menu will have extended hours for those wishing to purchase some snacks before the show or bring something to BBQ. Benito will be in the kitchen serving up the bar menu from 5:30 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. and the bar will have your favorite adult libations available for the best price on the Island.

"Beer Can 101: A Refresher Course"

April 13th will be our first beer can race of the season. The staff has been busy preparing the club for this traditional signaling of the start of spring & fun filled Wednesday nights at CYC. I think this is a perfect time to remind all of you some of the policies that we have in place to help you, the membership, maximize your enjoyment of the club.

Parking

The CYC parking lot is for members only, please have your guests park in the city's lot located to the West of the side lawn or on Pomona Ave.

Guests at the bar

Please escort your guests to the bar when they are ordering as it is a violation of our club liquor license to serve non members and unescorted guests. CYC can be fined thousands of dollars for a violation and receive a suspension of our liquor license. The bartenders will not provide service to any unescorted guests.

Corkage Fee

Although we offer a very expansive wine list for your enjoyment at the bar, I understand that some of you prefer to bring your own wine. Please check in with the bartender to pay the appropriate corkage fee and receive your "corkage paid" sticker. Bottles that were not purchased from the bar nor have a "corkage sticker" will be confiscated, you will be asked to leave the club for the day and you will be invited to attend the next Board of Directors meeting.

B.Y.O.B. NO WAY!

Corkage fee is only applied to wine bottles as it is a violation of club rules to consume your own beer or liquor in the clubhouse, front deck, or side lawn. Violators will be asked to leave the club property for the day and may be suspended by the Board of Directors for a longer period of time.

Reserving tables

Tables on the club's main deck and bar area cannot be reserved by placing a sign and/or cooler on the tables. These tables are for members with reservations with the club's restaurant. The side lawn area, Port Side Patio, fire pit area, and Starboard Patio area can continue to be reserved with a cooler and/or sign.

Bounce and go...no, no!

The bounce house is provided as a benefit for our young families and future Commodores. It is not a babysitting service. The attendant is there to assure a safe environment for the children is provided. Our attendant is NOT a BABY SITTER. As the CYC house rules state children under 10 must be accompanied by an parent or adult supervision at all times while on club grounds. Please enjoy the club, but also keep an eye on your children.

Since we are currently several Membership slots below the "held" number, the need to establish such waiting lists has waned.

In the interim, the Membership committee is actively looking for ways to streamline the application process, including digitizing wherever possible; and finding ways to improve the CYC member experience.

Happy Spring!

We are closely approaching a waiting list for Flag and Social Members. The recent increase in membership has positively affected our income statement and cash flow, considering the additional top line revenues from monthly membership fees and initiation fees.

Our Operational Checking and Replacement Reserve accounts are sound. Controller Erica Mason is doing an excellent job with bank reconciliation. Before each board meeting, the previous month's bank reconciliation is completed and reviewed, as well as a Treasurer's review of accounts payable, accounts receivable, cash flow, trail balance, budget tracking, deposits, policies and procedures.

Investments are tracking well and continue to compound, considering our conservative, low-risk stance with our Vanguard accounts for Capital Improvement and Slip Replacement. General Manager Lou Milioti, Controller Erica Mason, myself, and the Finance Committee, continue to research cloud-based accounting software and format updates that will improve financial reporting accuracy and forecasting, as well as providing financial statements that are more clear.

We continue to evaluate expense performance and pricing to identify prudent savings and efficiencies while not compromising the membership experience. Several items have already been identified. Rethinking expenses and documenting the true cost of certain items is a responsible exercise. By tracking expenses and any cost overruns and understanding what factors are driving the numbers, a more concise, lean, balanced, and accurate future budget process will be developed. The Finance Committee, led by Finance Chair and Vice Commodore **Bill Sandke**, is doing a great job updating and developing the new budget.

Food and Bar Blog:

As Chair of the Foodservice and Bar Committee, I will be reporting various topics throughout the year.

One goal of the 2016 Foodservice Committee is to streamline our menus and wine list, while still satisfying wide membership target demographic. In addition to physical comment cards available at the club for member feedback, our staff will now send out a simple quarterly electronic survey to capture more feedback from members in regards to Food and Bar. Office Manager Jane Lee has done an excellent job putting together the electronic survey through Google Forms at no cost.

Although the feedback is great overall (95.77% positive 1/1/2015 – 2/10/2016) according to historical data mined from the physical comment cards the club has received, it became clear that we were not capturing feedback from every member that is dining with us. Our goal is to capture as much quality data as possible so that more, all encompassing improvements can be made.

From 2/27 – 3/20/2016, we received 147 electronic surveys so far, most of which are from members who do not usually dine with us. We are receiving great, constructive member input through the electronic survey. We want these members to dine with us. The electronic survey is scheduled to end on 3/31/2016. We will analyze the electronic feedback and make recommendations to GM Lou Milioti and Clubhouse Manager Mark Leopold in regards to reshaping the menu this year.

Best Dressed Docks

The competition for **BEST DRESSED DOCK** on **CYC OPENING DAY** and the feast that is awarded to all the winners by our Board of Directors is there for the taking by any dock or section of a dock!

... *aww phooey you say!* ... "D" dock always wins because they have 20 boats... WRONG!

"AB" dock has been a consistent winner as well for the past several years with 18 boats and this year "E" dock, "C" dock, "B" dock, "AA" dock, "AC" dock, "AD" dock and "AW" dock shall be measured off with as close to "D" docks 20 boat number as possible. This means that those people who have boats in that section will have an equal chance to win! And remember, it is CYC, our community of Coronado and to some extent the greater San Diego area boating community that benefits as we display a full marina area with beautiful, colorful flags commemorating our Memorial Day celebrations.

... That's our goal! Every boat dressed!



So to help achieve this "D" and "AB" docks are sharing with you the **"secrets to win!"** ...

- 1.) One to two people must volunteer to be the leader(s). This involves:
 - Calling all boat owners and having them buy the "proper" signal flags.
 - Ones with separate toggles/loops, not a sewn together string of flags.
 - Correct flags available at West Marine or equivalent. About \$70.⁰⁰ +
- 2.) You will need to recruit two/three others to help people set flags.
- 3.) You need to know the proper order to set the flags from bow to stern, how close to the water each end should be and the type of weights to use. Empty wine bottles tied on and duct tape works well. Details are in Chapman's Piloting & Seamanship book. CYC has copies of the applicable pages to follow for you at the Office.
- 4.) Some people will not dress their boats for many reasons, some being they can't do it physically, won't be in town, can't do it by themselves, don't know how to do it, etc. You & your team must be ready to help. Actually having a spare set of flags set in the correct order makes it easy to dress a boat. Be sure you have the owner's permission to board their vessel. Having each boat owner store their flags in the proper order makes life much easier for subsequent years.
- 5.) Decorating your dock for "Judgement Day" is just fun! Your boats will win on all boats dressed and flags in proper order.

Having our Club completely dressed out is a great way to honor our Veteran's on Memorial Day and would create a beautiful statement for our Club and community. Call Port Captain **Dave Flint** or Club Members **Joe Aldous** or **K. Scott Grimes** with your questions. Then, get ready to party!

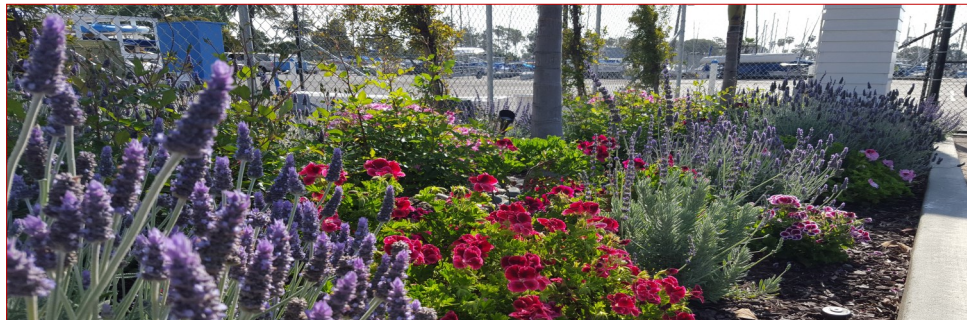




Entertainment Corner

Cruiser Navigation Fleet

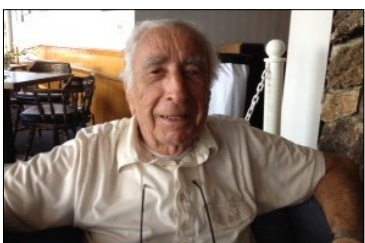
Our third 2016 cruiser navigation contest was held on Saturday, March 19, beginning with a dense marine layer giving way to bright sunny skies and gentle NW winds. This contest was sponsored by the Silver Gate Yacht Club.

Unlike the first two contests, this contest was a "traditional" cruiser navigation contest prohibiting the use of the GPS. All scored "Marks" were either buoys or cross ranges that could be sighted from the bridge. This protocol led us to focus on the currents, predicted to be a strong ebb current peaking about race time in the morning.

The course began at the green channel buoy "21" south of Harbor Island. From there, the course led west to the western mile markers and back east to a range created by the green channel buoy "21" and the aero beacon on the North Island Naval Base. Leading south, the first scored "Mark" came as a range was made on the north side of the Navy Pier (adjacent to the "Midway"). The course continued south all the way to the red channel buoy "30" for the second "Mark." After a short timed run to the diamond marker on the Silver Strand, the course led east to red channel buoy "28" for the third "Mark," and then north to the bridge for the fourth "Mark." Continuing north, the last "Mark" was set at the Navy Mooring Buoy "19" near the east end of Harbor Island and the Finish was just a short distance east aligning the Coast Guard hangers across from Harbor Drive.

The currents turned out to be a strong ebb, just as predicted. In fact, they were greater than predicted near the start of the contest, leading many contestants to over-compensate for these currents in the south bay where the currents were just about as predicted.

After the contest, we all gathered for lunch, followed by the announced scores and rankings for the day, at the Silver Gate Yacht Club. Coronado fielded three of the nine contestants. When the scores were tallied, **Jeff Calabrese** led our Club with a third place finish. **Magnus Karlsson** closely followed **Jeff** with a fourth place finish. Congratulations **Jeff** and **Magnus**! Your scribe did not fare as well, having miss-judged the first scored Mark at the Navy Pier. All those bollocks, cars, and tourists blended together in the morning sunlight! Another learning experience accompanied by a great morning on the water.



On a sad note, we observe the passing of **Irving Rubinstein** (picture left), a long time CYC member and an enthusiastic cruiser navigation contestant. During the late 1980s and beyond, **Irv**, together with **Adm. Bob Erly**, **Jerry Wellnitz** and others, were driving forces to assemble and field a competitive cadre of predicted log racers. **Irv** was instrumental in developing a

computer based current prediction model using early IBM computers and programming software. **Irv** also helped each member of our group calculate their monthly course predictions using his skills at developing computer-based Lotus 123 spreadsheets. We all learned a lot from **Irv**, and will miss him as a friend and competitor at the Club and on the water.

Next month we'll be on the water again to see if we can master the wind and currents. The contest will be sponsored by the San Diego Yacht Club, where we will gather following the contest to enjoy a luncheon, assess the results of our competition and hopefully celebrate our good luck.

We continue to encourage both established and new members of Coronado Yacht Club to consider participating in our monthly cruiser navigation events. Make plans now to join our cadre of CYC contestants in 2016.

 *Update from the RBOC*

Last month we has a lesson about a few acronyms. Now we are going to talk about a couple more acronyms. The first one is WER (Water Effect Ratio) which is an EPA approved method of testing for toxicity. The WER method is EPA approved for use with salt water. Another one is BLM (Biotic Ligand Model) which is another method of testing for toxicity of water. The EPA has approved the BLM method of testing for fresh water, but has not yet approved it for testing salt water. Other than the fact that both methods can test for toxicity, one is easier and less expensive than the other. You guessed it, the unapproved BLM test is less expensive and easier to use. The difference in cost can range from 10:1 to 20:1 depending on site factors involved. Testing the SIYB using the WER could cost as much as four million dollars.

Now we get to the crux of it. Why hasn't the BLM test for salt water been approved? RBOC has inquired of the EPA about the status of it's approval. The standard answer is that is in work. The response does not give an estimated completion date. This year it is the plan of RBOC to initiate a major writing campaign to congress and the EPA to push for approval of the BLM test for saltwater.

Making or breaking CHSST's National Championships

Tensions for Coronado High School's Sailing team rise as the Pacific Coast Championship approaches. The team has been working nonstop with coaches Kate Sheahan and Bryan Lake to prepare for the event. The team has an impressive record thus far in the ten-percent regattas. There are a total of five ten-percent regattas throughout the course of the school year, however, only a team's best three ten-percent regattas count for their overall score. Our team is ready for the competition. Practices have been held several times a week since the Christmas break, and our coaches have been whipping us into shape with team runs after practice. The closer we get to events, the more effectively we train, focusing on the key aspects of the venue we will be sailing: Santa Barbara, Long Beach, etc. It's a safe bet that the Coronado varsity sailing team will go far this year.

If you are having issues that may prevent you from meeting your underway requirement, please contact the Port Captain and the club office and let them know.

According to CYC By-Laws f. Each yacht assigned to and kept in a CYC wet slip or dry slip shall be actively engaged in yachting, and be capable of getting underway from its slip and performing the underway-yachting activities appropriate to comparable yachts. Each Member keeping a yacht in a slip assigned to them at CYC must demonstrate that the yacht is capable of getting underway a minimum of one time each year, with the Member on board, by traveling under its own power to Glorietta Bay buoy # 1 and back to its slip. While your requirement is to take the boat to the bridge and back - ONE TIME PER YEAR - Your vessel should be able to make this journey at any given time throughout the year- what better time to get your vessel ship shape, to the bridge and looking great for the Coronado Opening Day Weekend!

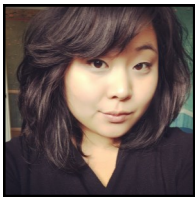

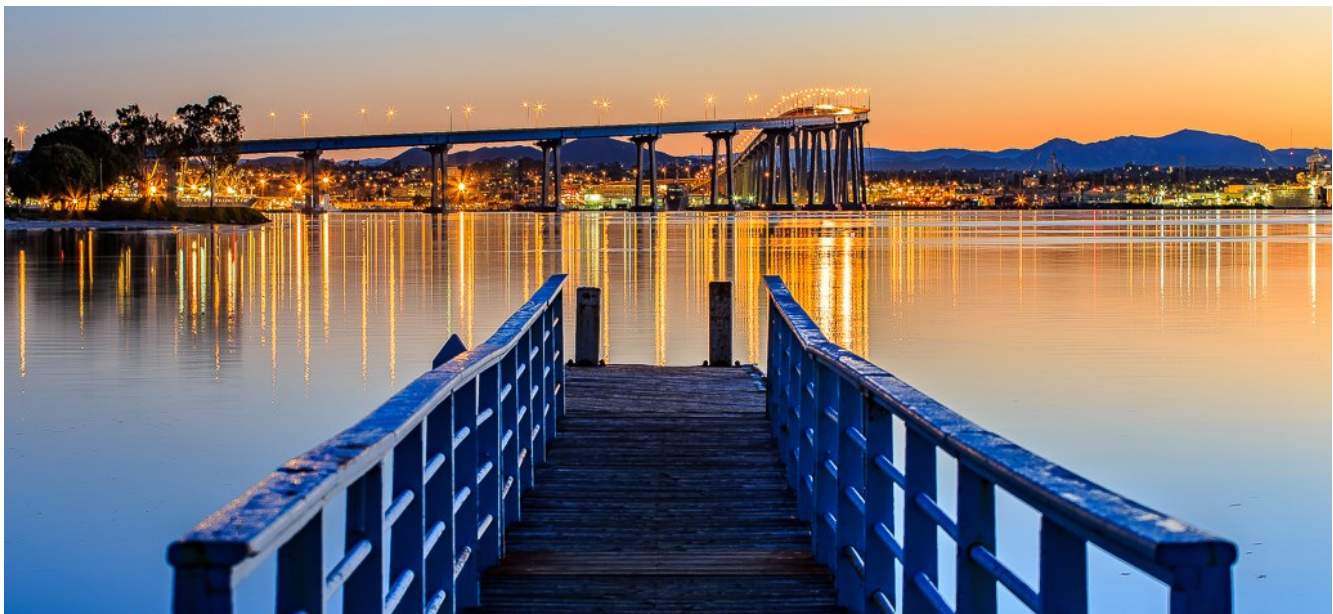

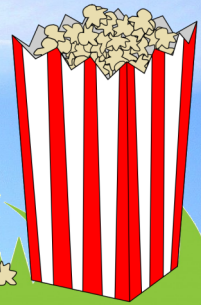
